The VIVA World Cup™ is the brainchild of Jean-Luc KIT after several decades of research and grants made to Federations non-affiliated to FIFA. This idea has accelerated in the wake of match Monaco-Tibet in Freiburg im Bressgau (14/01/2001).

With OMF (World Footballs Observatory), the first elements of the VIVA World Cup™ were developed (the name of the competition, supported by Luc Misson (attorney for the BOSMAN case), Trophy and concept) and were presented at the preparatory meetings for the constitution of N.F.-Board (February 2003). The intention was to entrust the realization of this concept N.F.-Board. Competition would be open to all Football Associations disallowed in the famous FIFA World Cup™. The motto of the competition is: **"If it's a beautiful world that plays is even more beautiful if everyone plays World !"**.

Finally born in 2005 with a first failed attempt, the startup will not be less laborious in the following year. In five editions, the VIVA World Cup™ has become the flagship event which has become thanks to her non-FIFA scene. Promised a bright future, both in view of the existing potential of the growing interest in Media and Federations, the competition is changing, but does not want losing its soul.

The cultural dimension as desired since its founding for this event will now be entered in Tender organizers.

VIVA World Cup™ is a real bargain and communication opportunity for the image of a host city. A new competition opens new horizons for football fans, Travel and exoticism. And when the game is resumed his place on the field, it's just a great time with the freshness Football needed. A bit like in the game of Rugby Referees = respect and opponents. As far as possible cases of all kinds.

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1/ First edition :

From 20 November to 24 November 2006. Originally scheduled in Northern Cyprus after validation of a reconnaissance visit by the President of N.F.-Board, policy changes have occurred in the meantime that territory, with repercussions on the FA of Northern Cyprus. Local authorities no longer receive certain admittance FA Emergency Committee NFB took the decision to cancel the planned edition over there and transfer competition in Hyères les Palmiers (France). With the help of Peire COSTA (President of the FA Occitania), and especially his uncle Florent COSTA and late aunt Hélène COSTA who took over with the late Leopold Ritondale (Mayor of Hyères les Palmiers) and Francis CANSON de la LOMBARDIERE (Mayor of La Londe les Maures) to organize last minute this first edition. After the packages of FA West Papua Rom announced a few weeks before the competition, the FA of the Southern Cameroons did not attend the kickoff against Monaco for a history of not granted visas ... So they rest ' rent three vying for the title. 8 with professionals working in the Champions League, UEFA Lapland made only bite his opponents with scores of Rugby. But the VIVA World Cup TM was launched! With 46 goals in 4 matches, and the craving to continue the adventure. The future will confirm that the most difficult was it!

2/ Second edition :

From July 07 to July 13, 2008. By playing this second edition to the north of the Arctic Circle (town of Gällivare in Swedish Lapland), with teams without financial means (except for the Kurdistan FA and FA Padania) was arguably the most unlikely of paris. Play for a first under the midnight sun was in the attraction. The arrival of the FA Kurdistan internationally aroused all media interests. The competition was tougher than expected with surprising Aramean team, the defending champions (do not have the time of their professionals) who found their rhythm a little later. The plateau of the competition were: Lapland, Kurdistan, Aramean Suryoyes, Padania and Provence. The Padans which also launched on the international scene with a few players from Serie A, won the race and became masters of the non-FIFA scene. In this edition, 41 goals were scored in 12 games.

3/ Third edition :

From June 22 to June 27, 2009. This marked the third edition was the quality of the organization and famous stadiums in which the games were played. The competition was hotly contested and growing level teams. The tray had this time : Padania, Kurdistan, Provence, Lapland, Occitania and Gozo newcomer. The final was played in beautiful Verona stadium and Padania won the title before the Kurdistan. In this edition, 49 goals were scored in 11 matches.

4/ Fourth edition :

From 31 May to 5 June, 2010. The small island of Calypso (30,000 inhabitants) hosted this year in an almost indifference Maltese. The plate was composed of Gozo, Padania, Kurdistan, Occitania, Provence and newcomer of the Kingdom of Two Sicilies. Padania won for the third consecutive time the "**Nelson Mandela Trophy**", and again before the Kurdistan. In this edition, 31 goals were scored in 11 matches.

5/ Fifth edition :

From June 04 to June 09, 2012. Most surprising in the end of this year was the number of teams (39) who wished to engage in this competition, in northern Iraq. Only nine had the privilege to participate: Kurdistan, Provence, Occitania, and a host of new as Northern Cyprus, Zanzibar, Rhetia or novices that are internationally Western Sahara and Darfur. We especially noted the great lack of Padania shaken by serious internal problems, Lapland, and Tibet just cancelled few weeks before the event. The victory did not escape the host FA in a stadium filled with 35,000 people, and a final each dreamed between Kurds and Turks. In this edition, 102 goals were scored in the 18 matches.

6/ Other editions :

The first edition scheduled for 2005 was eventually delayed by a year due to lack of budget. Parallel the "*Development Cup*" was played in 2006 with small teams (Chechnya, Occitania, Provence. Provence won). It also was played in 2008 between Gällivare women teams Lapland and Kurdistan. This repetition of what would later become **WOMEN VIVA World Cup**™ was won by Lapland in the two matches. The **WOMEN VIVA World Cup**™ was finally launched in 2010 in Gozo between Gozo and Padania. Padania won the title in two matches. Trophy "*Mother Teresa*" launched during the centenary of the birth of the holy woman, rewarding the winner of this competition, expects its second edition (in Western Sahara?). Finally, a trophy named "*H.C. Cup*" (a tribute to Helène COSTA will be launched as part of a future for the young festival called "*VIVA FESTIVAL*"™).

Created in 2006 by the official designer of the NFB, the ball "Fiesta" was officially presented at the Annual General Meeting (the third) in The Hague (Netherlands) on 30.09.2006. The colors of the stars represent the Peoples.

It was used during the final minutes of the first VIVA World Cup 2006 TM in Perruc Stadium Hyères les Palmiers. Accidentally released the stadium during the match this single copy was lost. He reappeared later in 2010 in Gozo where it was used for matches in the competition.

In 5 editions, 267 goals have been scored in a total of 56 matches.

Statistic : 4.76 goals per game average.
